Clinic Information. These clinics are introductory level to high power rifle competition. Both experienced and novice shooters are encouraged to attend. Instruction and coaching will be conducted before each stage of fire. These clinics will be run in accordance with both NRA and CMP rules and line commands.

Registration at the range. Range will open at 7:30am. Registration will be at the 200yd firing line between 7:30am to 8:30am. **Squadding will end at 8:30am.**

Eligibility: Open to the public to anyone who can legally possess a firearm, or Juniors accompanied by an adult may compete. The Chief Range Officer reserves the right to disqualify any unsafe rifle, ammunition, or competitor.

Equipment Allowed: Equipment allowed will be in accordance with current NRA rules. Rifles allowed are NRA Match Rifle Rule 3.3 or 3.3.1, or Service Rifle Rules 3.1, 3.1.1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3 or 3.1.6. Metallic sights-Rule 3.7a. Scoped and Any Sight Match Rifle (3.3.4) Compensators or muzzle brakes are prohibited (Rule 3.16.1). Empty chamber indicators are required.

Course of Fire: 30 shot JC Garand Course

Note: Competitors will fire the entire course of fire with no relay changes. All stages will be fired at 200 yards on the SR targets. Be sure to bring 300 and 600 yard ammo – a vote of the competitors may decide to shoot a full course.

Relay 1 (experienced shooter) will fire their 30 rounds for record while demonstrating proper technique and offering an explanation to the new shooter who will be scoring for them. After this, relay 2 (new shooter) will fire their 30 shots, with Relay 1 coaching. Relay 3 will be pulling targets. After firing is completed for relay 2, there will be a pit change and relay 2 will go to the pits for target-pulling instruction. Relay 3 will then shoot.

© Competitors will perform scoring and pit duties on their assigned relay. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. *Hats, eye, and ear protection are highly recommended during pit relays.*

Classifications and Awards: NRA High Power classifications will not be used. *This is not an NRA or CMP sanctioned Clinic and scores will not count for classifications.*

© **Clinic Award:** High scores in the aggregate will be recognized at the end of the Clinic.

General Information: Squadding is done at the range on the day of the Clinic, but telephone or e-mail pre-registration or questions are welcome. If you find you will be unable to attend after pre-registering, the courtesy of a phone or e-mail cancellation as soon as possible would be appreciated.

Water and restrooms are available. *There will be no food or sodas provided.*
